→ Reading

→ Listening

In the Listening section, which includes academic and social listening activities, candidates have a few seconds at the beginning to look through the questions, and half a minute at the end to check answers, just like the exam.

→ Exam Tips

The number one objective of **Road to IELTS** is to prepare candidates for the exam. There is a detailed explanation of each question type and tips on how best to tackle the tasks. This means candidates are thoroughly prepared before they enter the exam hall.

→ Speaking

In the Speaking section, videos of candidates from different language backgrounds take the learner through each of the three stages of the test, providing models of good and less good practice.
